Explain subtle wording and exam logic so learners understand what the question is really testing.

4

Practice under pressure

Use simulator-style questions, review patterns, and focused correction to build exam confidence.

5

Convert learning to action

Bring concepts back to reporting, governance, stakeholder conversations, team alignment, and delivery control.
